Key concepts: beauty, change, dreams

We are going to learn about life in the North and South Pole. We will be exploring weather patterns and using aerial images to compare them. These tasks are designed to help extend our learning at home. Pick as many as you like and bring your homework into school throughout the half-term. Please note that display space is limited - we share and value all homework but don't always have room to display everything.

Make your own Slush Puppy! Can you make different flavours?	Create a poster about the animals that live at each Pole.	Who discovered the Poles? Write a diary as one of these explorers.
Who lives at the Poles today? Create a fact-file.	If you were stuck on one of the Poles, what would you need to survive?	Captain Scott failed to make it to the South Pole first; write a diary explaining what went wrong.
Fillet a fish and make your own fish fingers!	Explore how ice melts; freeze a block of water and see how quickly you can get it to melt.	No two snowflakes are the same; create a snow themed picture.
Write a poem about one of the Poles, or include both.	Perform a dance to "Ice, Ice Baby"!*	Measure and record the temperature here for a week - keep a diary and compare it to the temperature of the Poles.
