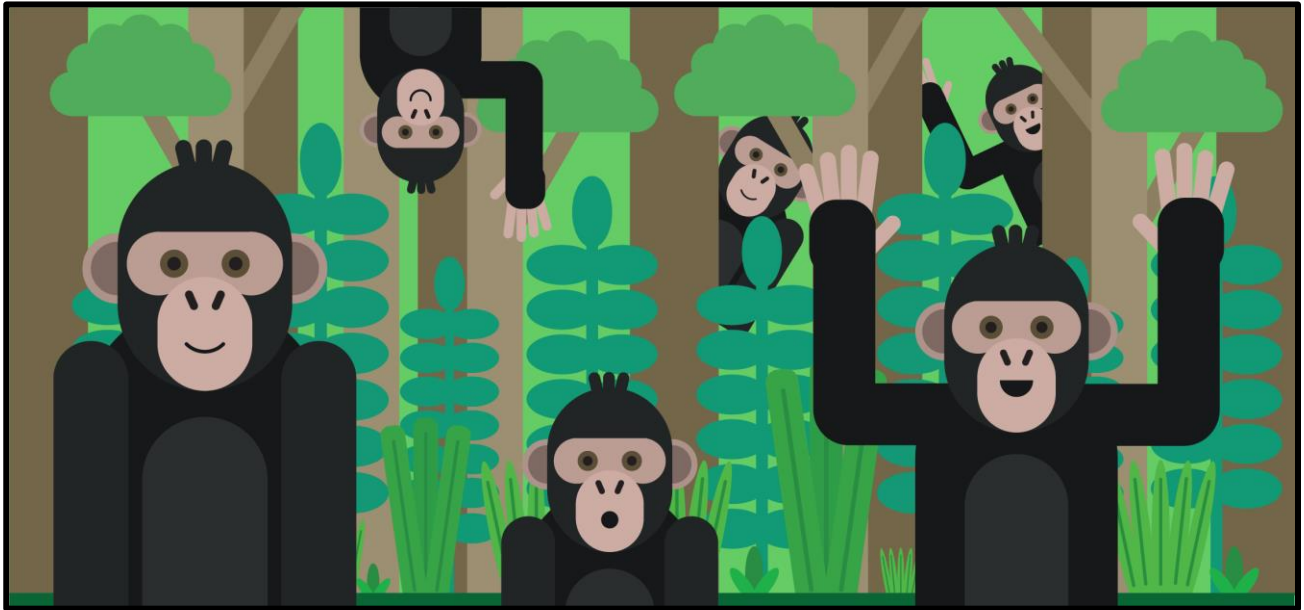

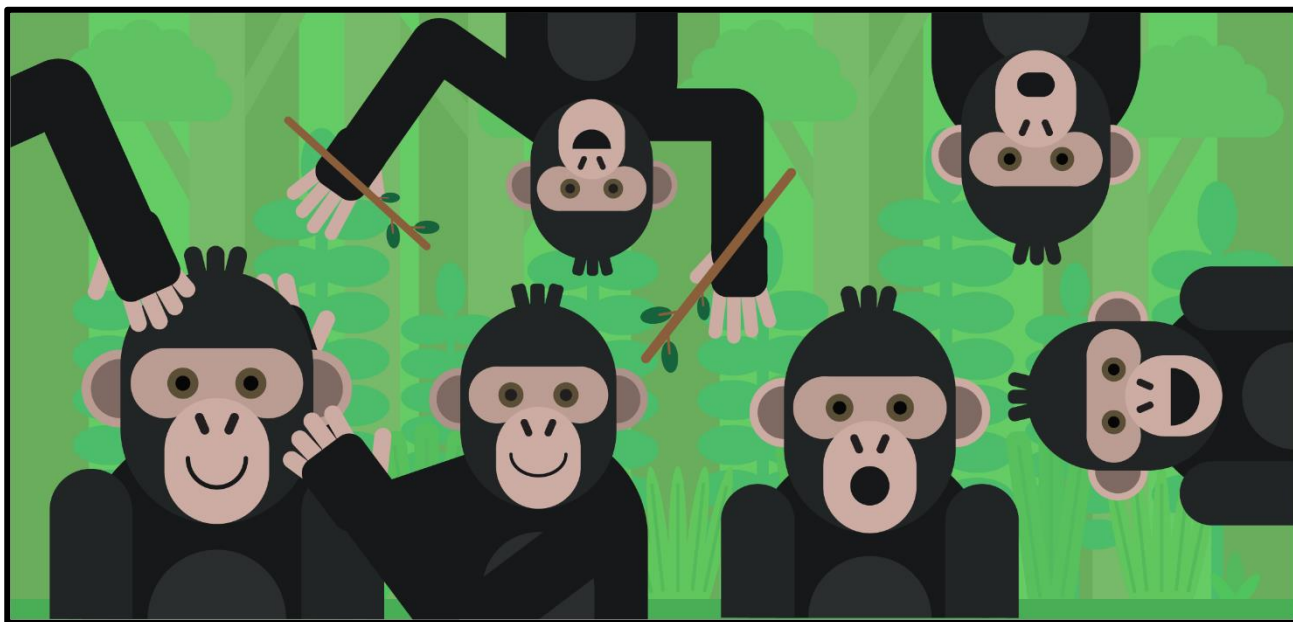
What do Chimpanzees eat?
