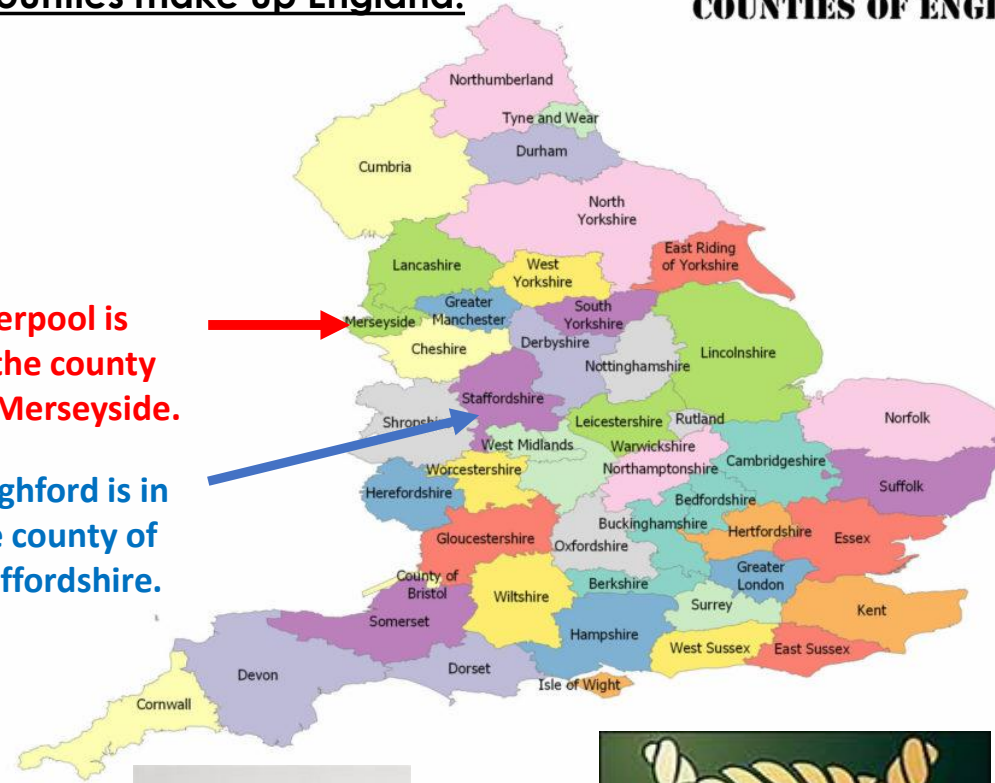

Urban - an area where many people live and work close together. The population density is higher than in the surrounding area. It is where buildings are close together. Urban areas are usually cities and towns. Most of the work available in urban areas is factory and office work.

Rural - These are areas which are not towns or cities. They are often farming or agricultural areas. Sometimes called "the country" or "countryside". People who live "in the country" often live in small villages, but they might also live somewhere where there are no other houses nearby.
