Worlds Apart: comparing life here with life in Peru.

We are exploring how life here compares to life in Peru. These tasks are designed to help you extend your learning at home. You can pick as many of the tasks as you like, and can bring them in to school at any point before the half-term holiday.



1. How could you travel to Peru from your house? Can you make the journey without using an aeroplane?
2. Collage a map of Peru – can you locate Lima the capital city? What about Machu Picchu? Or other landmarks?
3. Learn how to say hello in Spanish! What else could you learn to say?
4. Can you make your own set of panpipes? And can you play them?
5. Peruvian crafts are bright and often involve weaving – can you learn to weave? Perhaps you could make a book mark, or a small hanging.
6. What food is traditionally eaten in Peru? Find out and have a Peruvian picnic!
7. Make a poster about Peru.
8. Imagine you are on holiday in Peru and write a postcard to someone at home. Remember to draw a picture on the back of the postcard. What might the stamp look like?
9. Can you find out about any famous people from Peru?
10. Can you count to 10 in Spanish, or even up to 20?
11. What currency is used in Peru? Can you create a guide, maybe even comparing it to the currency we use?
12. If you went to Peru, how many hours behind would you be?
13. How far is Peru from the Equator?
14. What animals are found in the wild in Peru – do any of them live in the wild here?
15. Listen to some Peruvian music and learn a traditional dance – why don't you video yourself and email it in?
