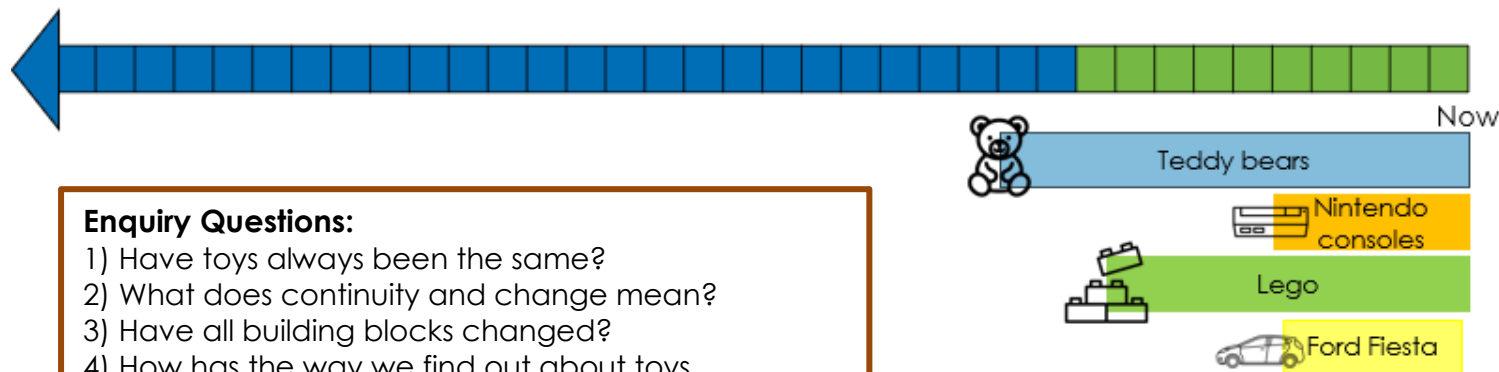


YEAR 1 – TOYS
