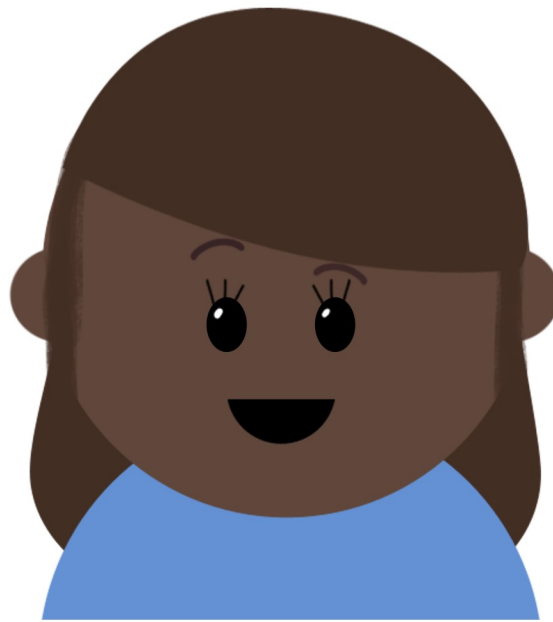

Q1) Complete the missing boxes in this intelligent practice challenge.

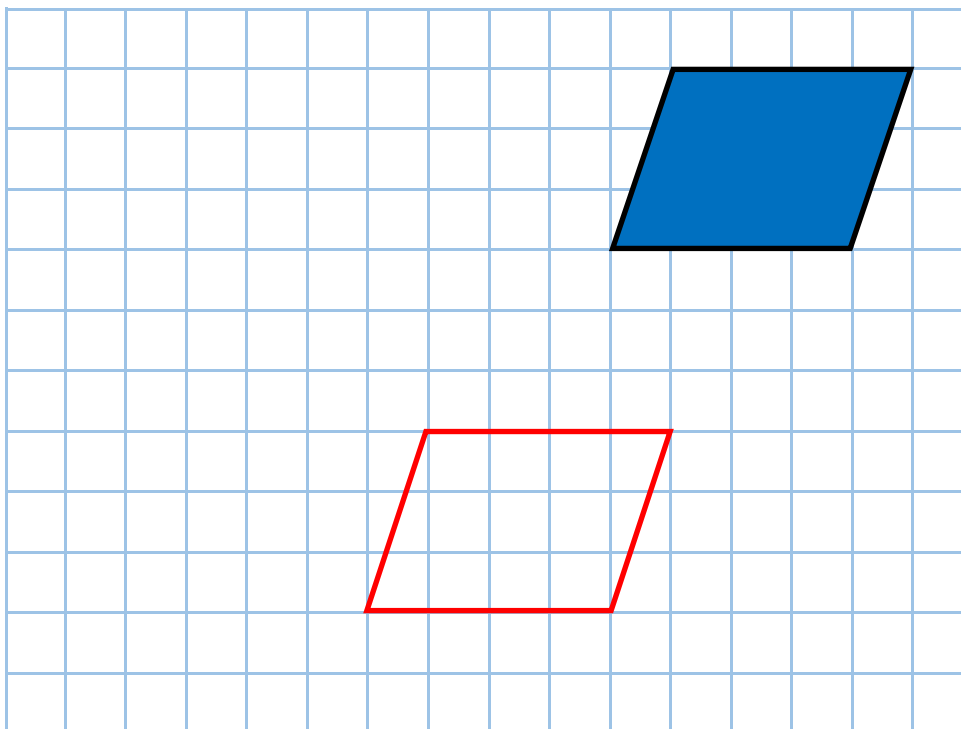

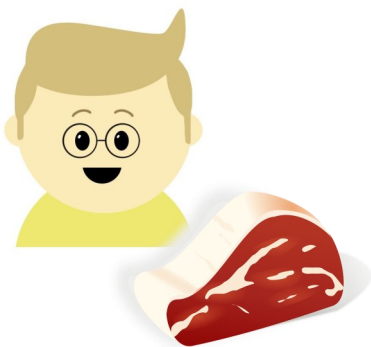
Q3) Circle two digits that should switch places to make this sequence correct.

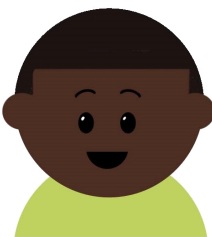

Explain why he is incorrect.



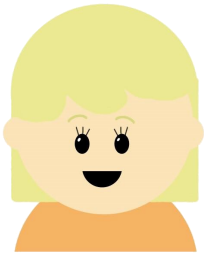
All numbers have an even number of factors. The only number that doesn't is 1.

Caleb is incorrect because square numbers have two numbers that are the same that multiply together. An example is 25 (5×5). This means its factors are 1, 5 and 25.

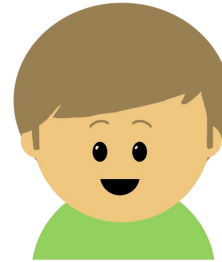


Q9) Two children are reading the same 240 page book.

Jane has read three tenths of the book.

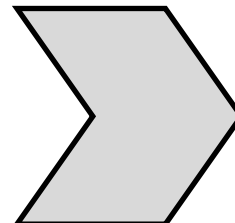
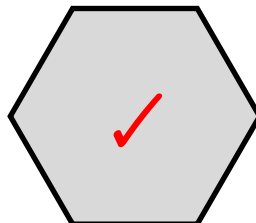
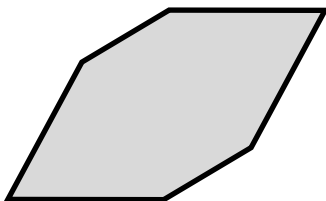
